In Pursuance of three warrants Granted to William and James Dixon one whereof bearing date the 24<sup>th</sup> day of August 1744, the second dated the 19<sup>th</sup> day of July 1749. and the third dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of April 1751. Afterwards resurveyed and divided off from the said larger Tract of Land by Thomas Armor late D.S under the said Geo. Stevenson, late D.S. And now at the request of Samuel Edgar the present owner the above has been Calculated examined and found correct and at his request returned for Confirmation the 17<sup>th</sup> Day of September AD<sup>o</sup> 1814 —
