



The above Draft No. 1 describes a Tract of Land situate in Hamilton Township, Franklin County (late Cumberland) Containing one hundred & twenty nine Acres and 151 Perches and the Allowance of Six P Cent for Roads &c. No. 2 describes a Piece of Land adjoining Containing fourteen Acres & 105 P & the Allowance aforesaid - the whole said to have been formerly Surveyed under John Armstrong Esq for - mery Dep^t Surv^r in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Alexander Ellis bearing Date the 24th May 1753 - But Robert Leeper alledging the Piece No. 2 is included in a Survey made upwards of forty Years ago un- der Thomas Cookson Esq then Dep^t Surv^r in pursuance of a Warrant granted to George Cummins (under whom he claims) produced a Copy said to have been taken from the original Draft of Survey made to Cummins, since Returned into the Surveyor Generals Office - upon seeing said Copy (tho not being Of- ficially certified) I examin'd & run the dotted Line S. 12° W. and blocking some of the old marked Trees found it to correspond to a Survey made about forty Years ago, allowing four Degrees Variation.
