



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Upper Milford Township in the County of Northampton (formerly Bucks:) in Pennsylvania Being the half of a Tract of 50^a which was the half of 200^a taken up by George Shoemaker. by Warrant of the 22^d November Anno. 1737. whose Son Frederick Shumaker. Sold the 50^a to Peter Miller, by an Agreement of the 17^d March. 1764. who also Sold the half thereof unto Jacob Shlough. and kept the above for himself.

Beginning at a Black Oak (now blown down) Thence by Land of Michael Knowse and Philip Kratzer. South East 65 perches to a Stone Set for a Corner of Jacob Shloughs, Land. Thence by the Same. South West 66 perches to a Stone. in the Line of John Adam Shoemaker's Land. Thence by the Same. North West 65 perches to a Stone. in a Line of Late John Knowse, now Michael Knowses, Land. Thence by the Same. North East 66 perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Twenty five Acres and 47 Perches of Land together with the usual Allowance at Six per Cent for Roads.

Surveyed and Divided for the said Peter Miller. — on the 15th April. Anno. 1768
