That part where the Letter *B*, is placed Containing 96^{perches} & 28^{perches} &c. Represents part of a Larger Tract of Land which was Originally Surveyed To Martha Finley. In pursuance of a Warrant for 100^{acres} Granted to the Said Martha Finley bearing Date the 16th Day of June 1786. Resurveyed and Divided off from the said Larger Tract of Land at the request of James Wells who sold the same to George Smith. Resurveyed & divided off as aforesaid the 13th day of July Anno Domini 1809. —
