In Consequence of a Certificate Issued by the Commissioners for adjusting the Claims to the unpatented Lands in the Counties of Yohogania Mongalia and Ohio of which the following is a True Copy We the Commissioners appointed for adjusting the Claims to unpatented lands in the Counties of Mongalia Yohogania and Ohio do hereby Certify That Thomas Prator is entitled to three hundred and Ten Acres of Land in the County of Yohogania Situate on the Waters of Red Stone Creek to include his Actual Settlement made in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & Seventy three also a Right in Preemption to one thousand Acres adjoining thereto. Given under our Hands at Redstone old fort this fifteenth day of November 1779 in the fourth Year of the Commonwealth
