



Situate on the Waters of Redstone Creek in Washington Township Fayette County and Surveyed the 26<sup>th</sup> day of March 1787. In Consequence of a Certificate Issued by the Commissioners for adjusting the Claims to the unpatented Lands in the Counties of Yohogania Monongalia and Ohio. — — Of which the following is a True Copy —

We the Commissioner appointed for adjusting the Claims to unpatented lands in the Counties of Monongalia Yohogania and Ohio do hereby Certify that Thomas Prator is entitled to Three Hundred Ten Acres of land in the County of Yohogania Situate on the Waters of Redstone Creek, to include his Actual Settlement made in the Year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred & Seventy Three, also a right in Preemption to one Thousand Acres adjoining thereto.

Given under our hands at Redstone old fort this fifteenth day of November 1779 in the fourth year of the Commonwealth.
