



A Draught of two tracts of land situate in Moore township Northampton County, the Dotted lines of No 1 Represents the whole tract originally Surveyed to John Rechner by Warrant of the 16<sup>th</sup> day of May 1791, Granted to the Said John Rechner Content 60 or 66 a and the allowance of 6 p C & G.

By Virtue of the above Mentioned Warrant Surveyed the 5<sup>th</sup> day of March 1851 to Peter Gross Administrator of his Father Philip Gross Dec'd in trust for the Heirs of the Said Philip Gross Dec'd in Right of the Said John Rechner the above Described tract of land No 1 Containing three acres and sixteen perches and the allowance of 6 p C & G.

The Dotted lines of No 2 Represents the whole tract originally Surveyed to John Frantz by Warrant of the 26<sup>th</sup> day of October 1774 Containing 73<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> 93 p and the allowance of 6 p C & G. By Virtue of the above Mentioned Warrant Surveyed March the 5<sup>th</sup> 1851 to Peter Gross, Administrator of his Father Philip Gross, Dec'd in trust for the Heirs of the said Philip Gross Dec'd in Right of the said John Frantz the above Described tract of land No 2 Containing three acres and sixty perches and the allowance of 6 p C & G.
