 to Contain 1047 1/2 & Allowance

Situate in Manallen Township York County and Surveyed the 23^d day of October 1786
 in pursuance of a Warrant for _____ Acres Granted to William Graham for _____ dated the 7th day of
 December 1785.

Sir) On proceeding to execute the above mentioned Warrant I found by a Draught amongst the Papers of Arch^d
 M'Cleane D.S. that the Spanish Oak marked on this Draft was the Beginning of a Survey called the Proprietaries
 & that the closing Line had not been run nor marked — I was then under the necessity to actually Run and
 mark it ^{On 15th April 1789} I began at the Bounding Spanish Oak and on allowing the usual Variation found to Measure 516.6
 and fell near two perches to the left hand of a Chestnut Tree Marked which I found to be where the Surveyor had
 Stop'd at as some of the Settlers were pursuing them with Guns — On rectifying my Course I found it to be S. 15.10' W.
 516.6 to Span of Beginning. On Compleating the Survey of William^{Graham} Land I found 38^o & 50^p & Allowance fall within the Manor, and
 32^o & 44^p & All^{ce} without — Not knowing whether the late Proprietaries would finally hold the same as a Reserve under the Act of
 Assembly (as it was about four Miles from the Manor of Maske, & said by the People not to be a Manor) William Grahms House
 being burned & he deceased shortly after, and my Fees not paid, I detained the Survey not knowing what to do in the business, un-
 til the fall of 1803 when Cap^t Alex^r Cobean applied to me to Survey the several Tracts insaid Manor, when I found it to be Called the Manor of
 Springetsbury — I surveyed and made out returns in the Manor for the respective Settlers, One for David Graham son of William Graham for the Part
 in the Manor, so that there remains for the Warrant 32^o & 44^p & Allowance. As I consider this Sir a particular Case I have made Stat-
 ment, that you may know how it came that the return was not made sooner, which I transmit without putting it into M^r Slobans hands,
 as is his wish such Cases should —
