



Situate in York Township in the County of York Containing as above set forth 95<sup>as</sup> & 66 perches and the usual allowance of 6 per Cent &c the part where the Letter A is placed is situate in the Springets-berry Manor And Contains 4<sup>as</sup> & 86 perches and the allowance The whole Tract surveyed on 17<sup>th</sup> of June A.D. 1837 for the Widow and Heirs of Martin Conaway in pursuance of a Warrant Granted to Martin Conaway for 80<sup>as</sup> Dated 29<sup>th</sup> Day of December A.D. 1821. I beg leave to state that this warrant was directed to Isaac Kirk D.S. at the time but he neglected to execute it and it has remained unexecuted until the 17<sup>th</sup> June 1837 no other Warrant has ever been executed on the Ground and now it is returned for Confirmation at the request of the Widow and heirs of Martin Conaway who wish to patent the Same all which is Respectfully Submitted
