



Situated on the Waters of Little Redstone Creek in Washington Township Fayette County and Surveyed the 15th day of February 1786 In Consequence of a Certificate Granted to the said Samuel Clark by the Commissioners appointed to adjust the Claims to Unpatented Lands in the Counties of Monongalia Yohogania & Ohio of which the following is a true Copy.

We the Commissioners appointed to adjust the Claims to Unpatented lands in the Counties of Monongalia Yohogania and Ohio do hereby Certify that Samuel Clark is intitled to four hundred Acres of Land in the County of Yohogania on Redstone Creek to Include his Settlement made in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Seventy also a right in Preemption to one Thousand Acres adjoining thereto.

Given under our - at Coxes fort the 23^d. day of February 1780 - in the fourth year of the Commonwealth.
