Survey'd the two above discribed parts of <sup>two</sup> tracts of land containing two hundred ninety six acres fifty two perches and allowance proportioned at six percent situate in Fairfield township in the county of Westmoreland ~~the~~ No. 1. Containing eight acres seventy perches & allowance it being part of a larger tract which was survey'd in pursuance of a warrant granted to James Galbraith dated June 2<sup>d</sup> 1786 said to contain in the whole tract 384<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> acres 37 perches & allowance of six percent &c. No. 2. Containing two hundred eighty seven acres 142 perches & allowance. It being a part of a larger tract said to contain in the whole 419<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> acres 146 prs & allowance which was survey'd to John Galbraith in pursuance of a warrant dated June 2<sup>d</sup> 1786.
