



The above tract is Situate in Franklin township, Fayette County on the South side of the Youghiogony river, on the waters of the same, and was surveyed on the 10th. day of November 1785 in pursuance of a warrant in the name of Jonathan Daugan dated the 27th day of September A.D. 1785 and was Computed (as appears from the books in this office) to contain 338 Acres & the usual allowance. It is represented by the dotted lines, . . . And from recent information, appears to have been regularly returned but not Patented. It is at present claimed by several different person, each claiming a seperate part, as the above diagram sheweth. Joseph Torrence of said township, the present claiment of the part represented by the thick black lines, has desired a survey & return of his part, with a desire to obtain a patent for the same, I have therefore at his request made the above survey on the 12th day of Nov: AD. 1839 which contains 113 Acres & 7 perches. The Improvements are; a New Stone house, a Log barn, & about $\frac{2}{3}$ cleared appears to have been settled 40 or 50 years.
