



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate formerly all in the County of Bucks and Containing one hundred and seventy acres and 149 Perches of Land together with the usual allowance of six per cent for Roads. That was formerly surveyed to Henry Rutter by Warrant dated March 16 anno 1737 but afterwards was by a vacating Warrant dated January 13th anno 1749 granted to Lawrence Erbach But afterwards when the said County was divided Then the Messuage with the greatest Part of the Land remained in the said County of Bucks and the residue fell in Northampton County. So that the Quantity of 96^{os} 102^{per} etc, thereof Including the Messuage remained in the said County of Bucks, in the Township of Lower Milford and the Residue Being 74 acres and 47 Perches et allowance is now situated in Upper Milford Township in the County of Northampton.

And he the said Lawrence Erbach by his Deed Poll, Dated on the 7th Day of May Anno 1785 Sold and Conveyed all his Right to the said Messuage and Lands to his only son Jacob Erbach.
