Surveyed to Philip Hendrickson including his improvement and actual resident settlement the above described tract containing one hundred and sixty four acres and allowance of six per cent Situate in Centre township Indiana County adjoining lands of Thomas Campbell Adam Altimus Jr Henry Shoup & others as above described. By Virtue of his warrant granted to the above said Philip Hendrickson the 18<sup>th</sup> of August A.D. 1849.

N.B.\* in the above diagram represents Henry Shoup's cabin recently put up and occupied by himself and wife though they were both absent when we ran the line by the house. I left a note for him and received in answer thereto the following injunction in writing after noticing or referring to the survey he says "I charge you now (27<sup>th</sup> of August 1849) to make no return thereof for this is all the home I have"
