We the Commissioners appointed for adjusting Claims to unpatented Land in the Counties of Monongahelia, Yohogania & Ohio & do hereby Certify that James Carson is entitled to four hundred acres of land in the County of Ohio on the waters of Buffalo Creek to include his settlement made in the year One Thousand seven Hundred and seventy four also a right in preemption to one hundred & fifty acres adjoining thereto.

Given under our hands at Coxes fort the seventeenth day of Febr'y 1780 in the fourth year of the Commonwealth.
