



Situate in Manchester township in the County of York containing within the black lines as above set forth 48^{ac} & 73^{ac} and allowance being part of a larger tract of 210^{ac} & 111 perches and all^{ac} which was originally surveyed by Charles Lukens late D.S. on the 14th day of August 1767 in pursuance of a Warrant for 200^{ac} granted to Philip Miller bearing date the 28th day of March 1767. Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger Tract by Peter Spangler D.S. under Jacob Spangler late D.S. on the 1st day of July 1813 and now at the request of the present owner David Jacoby I am desired to make return of the Draught as calculated examined and found to be correct the 20th day of March A.D. 1819.
