



Whereas I William Elliott of Mercer county have Entered a Caveit in the Land office of Pennsylvania against a Patent Issuing to George MWilliams on his Warent Dated 3<sup>d</sup> February 1803 a survey having been Made and Return in Pursuence of said Warent the above diagram being a part of said Survey

These are therfor to authoris and Require that my said Caveit be withdrawn and be henceforth considerd as having no Effect to Prevent a Patent Issuing to said Geo. MWilliams for all that part of the Survey maid in Pursuence of said Warent that is containd in the above diagram witness my hand this 30<sup>th</sup> Day of october 1807

Personally appeared before me the subscriber a Justice of the Peace in and for said County Geo MWilliams who on his oath Duly administerd saith that he has no claim whatever Nor never had to that Part of a Survey Maid in Pursuence of a warent Granted to said MWilliams and Returned to Surveyor Generals office by In<sup>o</sup> Findley Deputy Surveyor of Mercer county which Lyes without that Part of said Survey from which Wm Elliott has withdrawn his Caveit but Mearly acted as an Agent for a certain Samuel Daily who Clames the <sup>same</sup> in virtue of a Purchase thereof from In<sup>o</sup> Mitchell the original settler on said tract the said Elliott Claiming the same by virtue of a Purchase prior to that of Daily
