



A Draught of one hundred and forty acres & one quarter of an acre of Land and the usual allowance of Six & Cent Situate in the township of Martick in the County of Lancaster (on the waters of Muddy Run) No. 1 Containing thirty seven acres & three quarters & the allowan- was Surveyed by George Churchman late Deputy Surveyor unto George McLaughlin In pursuance of his warrant dated the first day of December A.D. 1750 and the Residue of one hundred & two acres and a half & allowan- was surveyed by said Churchman (with other land) unto said George McLaughlin and Alexander McLaughlin In pursuance of their warrant dated 24th day of May 1753 on the 6th of the 11th Month then following as by a General Draught including three surveys Returned into the Surveyor Generals office in the names of George & Alexander McLaughlin will appear

N. B. the line marked thus (*) (in the original Return) is only 69 1/2 perch and chains 92 and the line marked * in said Return was only 51 perches in stead of sixty one perches
