



A Draught of fifty Acres and allowance of Cripple & Flatts in Hopewensing Township situate in front of William Jones's Meadows part of Greenwich Island surveyed the 10<sup>th</sup> Day of May 1766 for said William Jones in Pursuance of a Warrant bearing date the 27<sup>th</sup> Day of March 1755 Granted to Thomas Preston for One thousand Five Hundred and four acres in any Part of the Province Purchased of the Indians being part of the Original Purchase of George Palmer Deceased - One Hundred Acres part of said 1504<sup>th</sup> the said Thomas Preston and Sarah his Wife by Indenture bearing Date the 24<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1755 did Grant and Convey unto Enach Elliot of Derby in the County of Chester and the above named William Jones then of Kingsess in the County of Philada<sup>a</sup> in Fee as Tenant in Common the above Fifty Acres is surveyed as William Jones's Part of the above Warrant
