


A Draught of a Tract of Land, situate in Upper Delford Township, in the County of Montgomery in the State of Pennsylvania, Being Part of a Tract of about one hundred acres of Land, et allowance, which formerly was surveyed to Jacob Rohr by Warrant dated on the 2^d April Anno 1737, who sold the same to Ludwig Hirsch and he again to John Kantz - and afterwards to Peter Wentz - who sold the same again to George Meyer, who now sold the above part thereof to Jacob Doup - - - - -

Beginning at a Stone, in the Line of Jacob Kants Land, thence by the same South West 15 perches to a Stone in the Line of Jacob Meyers Land, thence by the same North West 2 1/2 perches to a Stone, and by the same and by Land of Henry Meyer, South West 113 perches to a Stone, set for a corner of George Meyers Land, thence by the same, North West 40 perches and 2 Souths to a Stone, thence by the same North 40^{deg} East 51 1/2 perches to a Stone and North 63^{deg} East 70 perches to a Stone, and North 54^{deg} East 28 1/2 perches to Stone (the said East two Courses are run in the Middle of a Road leading to Bucks County) in the Line of Philip Renns Land, thence by the same South East 19 perches and 2 Souths to the Place of Beginning, Containing Twenty five Acres of Land, Strictly or Twenty three Acres, and 94 perches of Land and the usual allowance for Roads, surveyed for the said Jacob Doup on the 6th April, 1785 -
