



In Pursuance of a Warrant granted to Samuel Rhoades and Luke Morris bearing date the 3<sup>d</sup> day of December 1773 I did on the eighth day of the same Month survey the above described two pieces or parcels of Land situate in the District of Southwark in the County of Philadelphia. One of them contains in Breadth on the West side of George Street 35 feet 3 inches, and on the East side of Third Street Continued Southward beyond the City 46 feet 10 inches, and in length along the South side of Cedar or South Street two hundred feet, containing thirty perches and one tenth part of a perch. The other of said pieces contains in Breadth on the West side of said Third Street containing 49 feet 9 inches, and on the West end by Ground of the Honorable the Proprietaries 71 feet 6 inches and in length along the South side of Cedar or South Street 375 feet, containing eighty three perches and a half.
