



In pursuance of a warrant to me directed from the Surveyor general's office and dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October A.D. 1850, I did proceed to lay off the above delineated tract of Land situated in Big Beaver township, Lawrence County, Penna. for Robert Baden, to wit, the bearings & distances, Beginning at the north west corner a Black Oak lying down, thence South 88 1/4 East 160 perches to white oak. Thence South 1/4 East 103 1/2 perches to post and white oak. Thence North 88 1/4 West 79 perch to Hickory. Thence North 2° West 19 1/2 perch to post. Thence South 87 1/4 West 55 1/2 perch to post and Sugar tree. Thence South 1/2 East 11 1/2 perches to a post. Thence South 66 1/4 West 55 perch to a post and Linwood on the bank of the Run. Thence North 1/2 West 121 1/2 perches to the place of the Beginning containing 101 acres, and 3 1/100 perches net measure. Andrew Boyd and William M<sup>c</sup> Cullough Chain carriers who was sworn according to law, and which tract is under fence and four fifths of it cleared and from the witnesses by me examined would appear to have been settled about the year 1812, by John Lowry, next John Lowry, next Adam Lowry & his heirs and back to John Lowry, next Saylor Steen and lastly Robert Baden.
