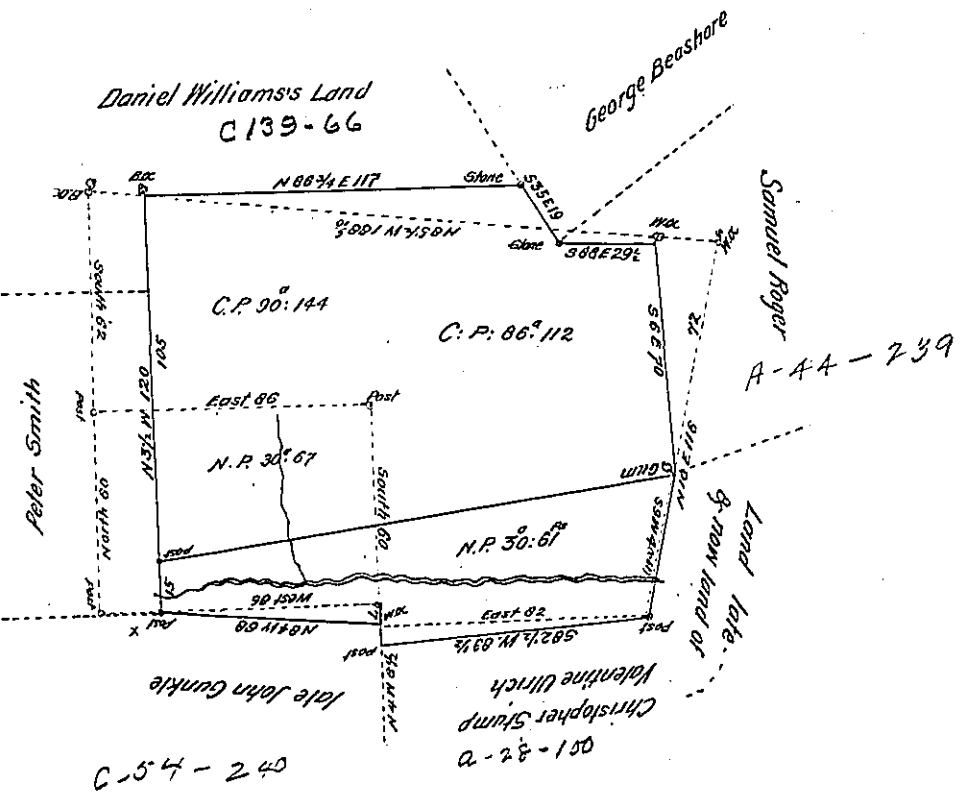

In pursuance of your Order of Resurvey (and special Directions therein mentioned) bearing date the 24th day of January 1797. to me Directed to Resurvey Two Tracts of Land situate in Bethel Township in the County of Berks, formerly surveyed by Jasper Scull (late Deputy Surveyor) on two warrants, one of them granted Nicholas Beebe dated the 1st day of May 1751, and the other of them granted to Christopher Beebe dated the 3rd day of April 1771, in order to ascertain the true Bounds as well as the Original lines of the same, I have Resurveyed the 28th day of February 1797. and examined the same. I do find that the original lines which are marked on the premises are agreeable to the Black lines in the above Draughts. The Red dotted lines represent the Figure of the Survey formerly made by the said Jasper Scull. - In order to inform myself more particularly of the errors of the former Survey, I run the courses & Distances out, as they call, but could not find any Marks, I then opened some of the marks in the lines above Drawn in Black and particularly the white oak tree the North East corner of the survey marked C. D. which exactly agrees with the Date of the said Jasper Scull's Draught. In the survey marked T. D. I suppose Mr. Scull must have erred in setting the Distances in the East and West lines, instead of setting down 68 perches, he set down 86 which put the whole survey out of order, as will more particularly appear by examining the above Draught joining the same. I have therefore no Reason to make alterations in the Draughts by me made on the 9th day of January 1797. by virtue of the said two warrants, into your Office.
