



A Draft of a tract of Land situate in Tamnet Township in the County of Franklin containing one Hundred and twenty eight Acres eight Perches and the Allowance of Six sq. Perches for Roads &c. for which Alexander Rotts, John Rotts, James Rotts & Robert Rotts have obtained a warrant bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> Day of September 1754.

The above Survey has been delayed on account of a report which has prevailed in the Neighbourhood of the Land for many years that a Survey had been made in the Year 1752 for a certain Thomas Doyle, and said to have included this Land. Upon the utmost enquiry now made at the Neighbours there, could find no Person who is able to show a Line of such Survey, and on making diligent Search in the most likely Places for Traces for those Lines, having a Copy of Mr Doyle's Survey with me and a number of the People there assisting, could find no Line nor Corner Tree corresponding thereto. Would for their observe respecting the Warrant granted to Mr Doyle, which bears date the 29<sup>th</sup> of November 1752, that it is located on the Suscarora Path within half a Mile to the Northward of a tract of Land surveyed to Samuel Bethel, and that the Draft of the Survey on said Warrant expresses a Branch of Suscarora running through the same - whereas the Land now surveyed (of which the above is a Draft) lies nearly Southward of the Land surveyed to Samuel Bethel about a quarter of a Mile & upwards distant therefrom, and lies some miles distant from Suscarora Creek or any of its Waters. After making the above Representation the Case is humbly submitted to the Surveyor General or the Board of Property Surveys & examined the 21<sup>st</sup> of September 1790.
