



By virtue of a warrant dated the 26<sup>th</sup> day of March AD 1755 surveyed the 10<sup>th</sup> day of August 1837 Warrant granted to John Dehoads Surveyed unto John D. Bowman, the above tract of Land situate on Lizard Creek and adjoining the River Lehigh, in East Derry Township Northampton County containing fifty five acres thirteen perches and the allowance of six per cent for Roads &c.

The above Warrant granted in the name of John Dehoads, it appears had never been executed, at least on examination of my office I can not find any return ever made on the warrant I thought it was necessary to state the facts so to enable you to ascertain if any return ever made in your office it also mentions in the warrant, if no return was made in six months from the date of it to be void which has not been done in this case, but if I mistake not that law has been repealed should it not be repealed the above survey would be void and of no effect. I suppose from this you can judge whether the return is sufficient yet or not (please let me know if it prove to be correct or what the result is of it)
