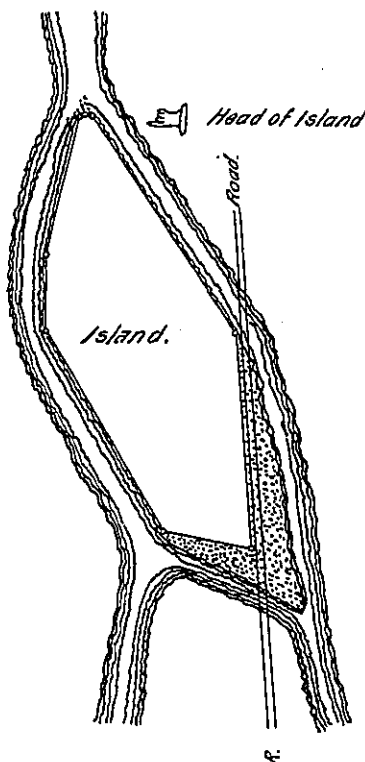


Beginning at a point at the head of the Island: North eleven and a half degrees, west, four and two tenths of a perch from a large Buttonwood tree

By virtue of a warrant dated the 28th day of March AD 1865 surveyed the first day of May AD 1865 to David Morris, George Hamilton and John Kehoney the above ^{described} Island situate in French Creek, between Head and Vernon Township Crawford County, adjoining lands formerly of Samuel Lord, now the C. & G. W. Rail Road on the east, and land of the heirs of H. J. F. Koopman on the West, (improved) containing three acres and one hundred and one perches, (more or less)
