vice President of the Supreme Executive Council & less Seal of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Dated the 20th Day of December in the year 1784.
Requiring 45 Acres of Land in the Haycock Township Bucks County adjoining Lands of George Fuller Philip Morris & Jacob Burns to be survey'd
into Conrad Heitman Jr if not already ^{subdivided} appropriated I have Survey'd into the s^t Conrad Heitman a Piece of Land situate in the Township of Hay-
cock as aforesaid Beginning at a Stone for a Corner being also a Corner of George Fullers Land thence by the same S 84° W 20' Dashes to Jacob Barnes'
Land thence by same S 32° E 83' & S 55° W 1' thence by Land of Henry Younken S 15° E 32' to the Line of Henry Amy's Land thence by the same & by
vacant Land S 025 1/2 E 88' to a Stone thence by Vacant Land S 039° 15' W 116' Dashes to the Place of Beginning Containing forty five Acres
