


Callowhill Street.

In Pursuance of a Warrant granted to Thomas Walter bearing date the 30th day of July 1770, and by him assigned to John Britian by deed endorsed on the back of said Warrant dated 18th day of June 1775, I did on the 24th day of the same Month, survey for said Britian, the above described Large Lot of Ground situate in the Honorable Proprietaries' Honor of Springbury, on the East side of Front Street Continued Northward, and on the North side of Callowhill Street, Containing Seventy Five feet in Breadth on Front Street, and in Length Two hundred and Fifty feet, Bounded Southward with Callowhill Street, Westward with Front Street Continued, Northward by the Proprietaries' 74th Ground, and Eastward by the River Delaware. And at the same time Divided the same into Eleven smaller Lots as above described. Returned into the Secretaries Office the 11th day of January 1775
