



By virtue of a Map from the Proprietaries Comm^{rs} bearing date the 26th 1704 to lay out unto Francis Plumstead 750 acres part of his purchase of 2500 acres, surveyed unto the s^r Francis Plumstead a tract of Land in Plumstead township in Bucks County Beginning at a black oak at Henry Childs corner thence North West by a township road 484 perches to two black oaks, then by vacant Land North East 248 perches to a post then by his other tract South East 484 perches to a Post, then by s^r Henry Childs land South West 248 perches to the beginning containing 750 acres

By virtue of another warrant from s^r Com^{rs} to me directed bearing date the 27th 1704 to lay out to s^r Francis Plumstead 750 acres the remainder and in full of his purchase of 2500 acres laid out unto s^r Francis Plumstead a tract of land in the s^r township beginning at a post at his other corner thence by his other tract N.W. 484 perches to a Post then by vacant Land N.E. 248 perches to a black oak, then by vacant South East 484 perches to a Post, then by his other land S.W. 248 p to the beginning containing 750 acres laid out the 11th 1704.
