



Whereas Thomas Pierson late of the Townp of Marple in the County of Chester dec^d being vested with a right of 250⁰⁰ the original Purchase of his brother John Pierson & of Mary Smith's 50⁰⁰ granted to her on Rent (she came in a free Woman therefore y^e Rent was 1^d. Sterling $\frac{1}{2}$ acre yearly & being afterwards married to Dan^l. Williamson they release to ~~Benja. Eastburn~~ ~~Williamson~~ the s^d. Thomas & they supposing y^e Rent to be but one half penny an acre & so mention it in y^e. Release but Thomas Pierson was convince'd of the mistake & paid 1^d. an acre Rent $\frac{1}{2}$ Ann.) There was survey'd to s^d. Thomas on y^e. 25th of 8ber 1683 by Charles Ashcom. (as is supposed without a Warr^t.) a tract in Marple computed to contain 350⁰⁰ by means whereof the s^d. Thomas became possess'd thereof & afterwards purchased 100⁰⁰ more adjoin^g ther^eof part of 300⁰⁰ confirm'd to George Willard by Patt^r a small ^{pt} of every of w^{ch} Quant^o in all amounting to one hundred acres. Thomas Pierson sold to his Son Enoch (w^{ch} by divers meane Conveyances is now vested in Josh^a. Way) & all the Rem^s as tis s^d to his son Robert Pierson who finding the Title deficient upon application to the Propriet^{es} obtain'd a Warr^t dated y^e. 15th of 8ber 1735 to Resurvey the Land laid out in right of Jn^o. Pierson's 250⁰⁰ & Mary Smith's 50⁰⁰ in pursuance whereof the above described Tract as bound^d by the green lines was Resurv'd on the 24th of the same Month & found to contain 300⁰⁰ & allow. of 10⁰⁰ $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent besides an Overplus of ninety acres & a half Resurv'd $\frac{1}{2}$ Benja. Eastburn Surv^r. Gen^l on this last an Allow. is made for Roads see y^e. Record of the Return
