



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Newbury Township in the County of York Resurveyed the 8th day of July 1789 by the lines formerly run in Pursuance of a Warrant to George Schneider Dated the 15th day of March 1775 Containing Eighty Six Acres and the Allowance of Six Acres ~~of~~ Cent for Roads &c.

N.B. The Piece Marked with the Letter A. (being part of the Eighty Six Acres) is Claimed by the Heirs of James Sharp by a Warrant in his name for 25^o Dated the 6th day of June 1774. But Schneiders Survey made by Lewis Lewis while Deputy for Charles Lukens bears Date the 28th December 1770 made then for Peter Title of whom Schneider Purchased, Schneider also shewed me Peter Title's Bill of Sale for the above tract purchased of Samuel Jones is Dated the 28th December 1767. The Piece of 25^o Mark'd with A. is all wood Land Except a small cor. of about 1/2 an Acre where this O Mark stands and if taken from Schneider will effectually ruin his Little place, Schneider is a Very Poor man. The above is a True State of Facts as they have come to my Knowledge.
