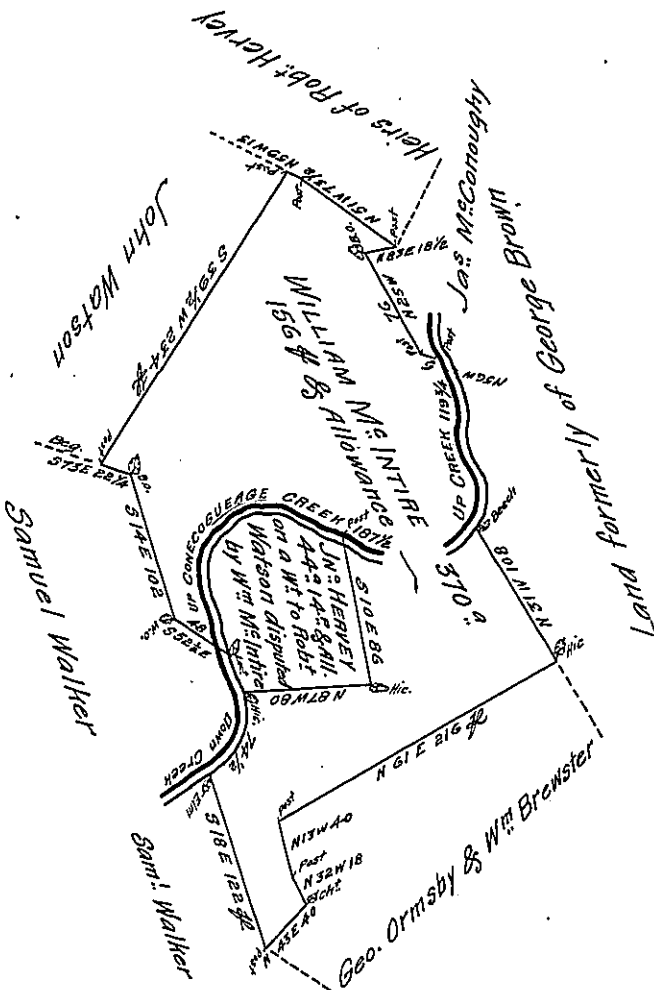

The above largest Draft describes a Tract or Parcel of Land situate in Fannet Township ^{formerly} in the County of Cumberland, but now in the County of Franklin. Containing three hundred and seventy Acres and 156 Perches and the allowance of Six ~~4~~ Cent. for Roads &c. Survey'd March 27th 1793 in pursuance of two Applications, one of William M^cIntire N^o 1685 and the other of Jean M^cIntire N^o 1688, both both bearing Date the 27th Day of October 1766. --- Said William M^cIntire also claims the survey of 44^{ac} & 14^p inserted on this Draft, on the Application of Jean M^cIntire, as formerly noted on the return thereof.
