



Situate Formerly in York township but now in Windsor township York County, Containing within the black lines as above set forth 3<sup>ac</sup> & 82<sup>ac</sup> & allowance. Being part of a larger tract of 196<sup>ac</sup> & allowance, which was Originally surveyed by George Stevenson late D.S. on the 23<sup>d</sup> day of April 1755, for John Feut Peter in his own right and in trust for the Heirs of Philip Gohn deceased, in pursuance of a Warrant bearing date the 4<sup>th</sup> day of April 1754. Resurveyed & divided off from the said larger tract by George Spangler D.S. under Jacob Spangler late D.S. on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of November 1817, and now on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of May 1819, the same has been calculated examined and found to be correct and at the request of the Executors of Philip Gohn deceased I am desired to return the same for confirmation.
