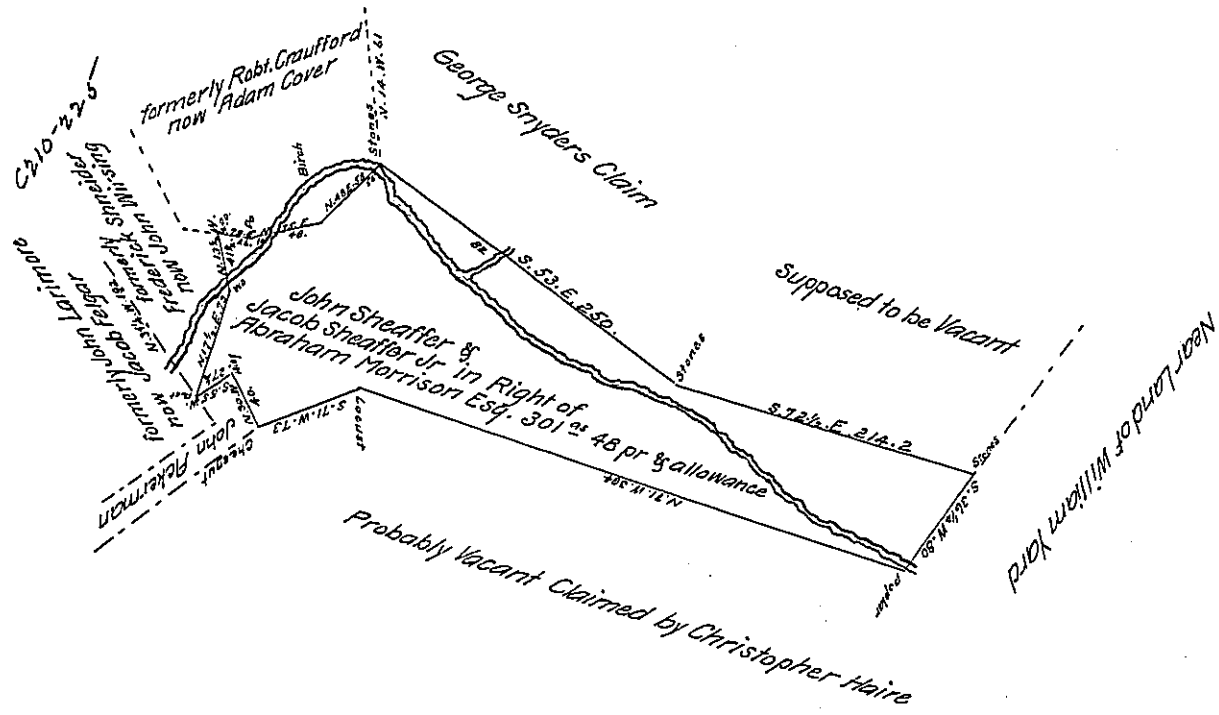

Note.) The above Survey embraces part of a Tract of land Claimed by the heirs of James Skean
 deceased. To Wit, all the land in the above Survey lying with in lines S. 53. E. 250 stones, S. 72 1/2 E.
 214.2 stones, S. 36 1/4 W. 80, Poplar N. 71. W. 394. Locust, and a line running from Locust N. 6. W. 139. post is within
 a Survey Made on the 6th May 1819 by Thomas Potter D.S. on Warrant dated the 2^d March 1819. granted
 to James Skean Containing 400^{ac} & allowance. And to prevent the issuing of a patent for said Survey of 400^{ac}
 Abraham Morrison says he filed a Caviat &c Geo. Mechling D.S.
