



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Frederick Township in the County of Philadelphia and Province of Pennsylvania.

Being Part of 235 acres, etc partly Surveyed to John Whiteman by Warrant of the 27th January 1736. and partly to Jacob Whiteman by application of the 11th March 1746. The same was afterwards sold to Dietrich Walker who now sold the above part thereof unto George Whiteman. —

Beginning at a Stone, a Corner of Henry Beyer's Land thence by the same North 15 degrees West 49 perches to a Stone, a Corner of the said George Whiteman's other Land, thence by the same North 70 degrees East 147. perches to a White Oak, in the line of Samuel Shuler's Land, thence by the same South East 20 perches to the middle of Perkomee Creek, thence in the said Creek downwards South 15 degrees East 40. perches and South 26 degrees East 18 perches, and South 73 degrees East 4. perches (Being by Dietrich Walker's Forge Land) to a Corner of the said Dietrich Walker's other Land (which is part of the above said whole Tract,) Thence by the same South 69 1/2 degrees West 118 perches to a white Oak, and North 10 degrees West 18 perches to a Stone and by the same South 84 degrees West 48 perches to the Place of Beginning. —

Containing Sixty Six acres of Land, together with the usual allowance at Six per Cent for Roads —

Surveyed and Divided for the said George Whiteman on the 31st August Anno 1773. —
