



A Draught of several Tracts of Land situate in Nockamixon Township in Bucks County shewing each particular Survey (Viz) The plan in blacklines No. 1. No. 12 is the Original Survey of Jeremiah Langhorns and John Chapmans Land and Contains 240 Acs. & 26 Per. & an. All. of 6 p. Ct. The Plan in Red lines No. 2 & No. 3. was Surveyed by John Watson for 149 Acs 107 Perches and an allowance of 6 p. Ct. but in the Lines thereof is included part of the Original Survey to Langhorn and Chapman, (Viz) No. 2 Containing 12 Acs 25 Perches and an Allowance of 6 p. Ct. & part of the survey No. 10 & 11 (Viz) No. 11. Containing 1 Acre & 123 perches and Allowance of 6 p. Ct. which taken from the Area of sd Survey there remains 135 Acres 109 Perches and an Allowance of 6 p. Ct.

The plan included in the Green Lines No. 4 & No. 5 (Surveyed by John Watson) and Contains 67 Acres 8 perches & Allowance &c. that part thereof No. 4. lies in the Original Survey to Langhorn and Chapman and Contains 42 Acs 72 Perches & Allowance &c. The remainder No. 5 Contains 24 Acres 96 Perches, and an Allowance of Six p. Ct. — The plan included in red Lines No. 8. hath not been patented, or properly before (now) Surveyed, and Contains 52 Acres, 6 Perches and an Allowance of 6 p. Ct. — No. 6. Contains 3 Acres, 21 Perches & an allowance of 6 p. Ct. — No. 7. Contains 14 Acres, 155 perches & an Allowance of Six p. Ct. — No. 9. Contains 30 Acs. and an allowance of 6 p. Ct. — No. 10. & No. 11 Contains 8 Acres, 116 Perches & an All. of 6 p. Ct. Resurveyed to Benjamin Williams the 31st Day of May & first & second days of June 1774.
