



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the Thirtieth Day of March Anno Dom 1738. I have Survey'd and Laid out unto John Wogan in the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the west Side Susquehanna river Three hundred and Eighteen acres of Land with allowance of Six P Cent Beginning at a Red Oak Stand on the Side of the S^d river & being a Corner wth James Hendricks Land Thence North thirty Six Degrees Westerly Thirty two Pches to a poplar Thence South Twenty Eight Degrees Westerly fifty perches to a Hickery thence South 68 Degrees Westerly Sixty two perches to a Poplar Thence South Sixty two Degrees Westerly Twenty Eight Pches to a white Oak Thence South Seventeen Degrees Westerly Sixty Eight Perches to a Black Oak another Corner of the S^d Hendricks Land Thence South Eighty Degrees Westerly One hundred and Eleven Perches to a White Oak North Ten Degrees West-erly One hundred Sixty Eight Perches to a Chestnut Thence North forty two Degrees Easterly Two hundred and Thirty two Pches to a Maple by an Inlett Dividing the Same from Thos Coxs's Island Then Down the same and by the S^d river near about Two hundred perches to the place of Beginning Survey'd June 18th 1739.
