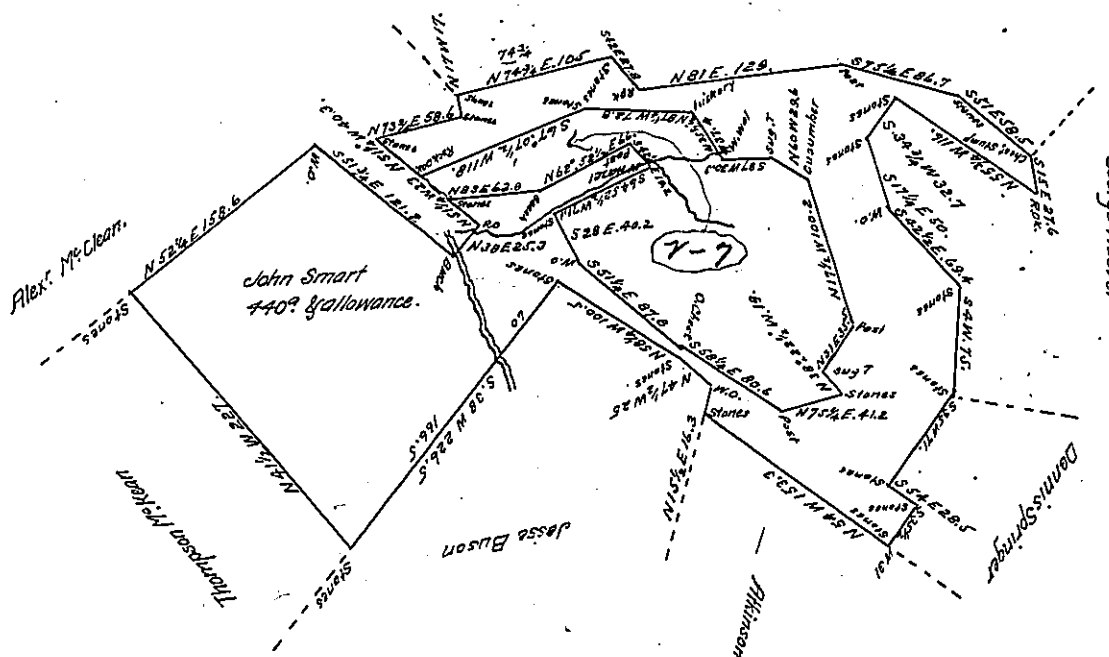

Alexander M^c Clean Senior caveats the acceptance of this Survey until a hearing before the board of Property
 or otherwise determined alleging a prior right by virtue of two warrants one of Sixty acres another of
 one hundred and fifty acres in part of the same also alleging that the one hundred and fifty acre
 Warrant is not laid off agreeably to the design of the owner, but to his injury. And as well because
 the land embraced in the sixty acre warrant, of ancient date is also in part included in the above
 Survey, the same not being known to the deputy
