



The dotted line marked "A" shows a line called for in the returns of the James Stewart and David Caldwell Surveys, as the West line of the Thomas Graig, but called in those returns Detrick Rees. Said line was later found and is admitted to be about 92 paces farther Easterly and about 24 farther Northerly, than by those returns shown to be.

A Draft of a tract of land situated in the Township of Tunkhannock and County of Monroe, containing Sixty Six acres, Sixty one perches and allowance of six per cent. for roads etc. Surveyed the tenth day of May 1894, in pursuance of a warrant granted to Amos Keiper dated the fifth day of April 1894.
