



A Draft of A tract of Land situate on the N.E. branch of Dunning's Creek Called Scrubgrass Creek - In St. Clair Township Bedford County containing Four Hundred and seventy acres and Thirty Nine perches and allowance of six per Cent for roads &c. Surveyed for Lewis Price on Warrant dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1763. No 1 represented by dotted lines is a draft of a tract of Land Surveyed for Paul Mock on Warrant dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August 1793 - This tract interferes one Hundred and ninety seven acres and seven perches with the Lewis Price survey - Paul Mock obtained the said Warrant and afterwards purchased from Thomas Stewartson Agent for sundry persons who claimed under Lewis Price - Paul Mock is the present owner. No 2 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of A tract of Land Surveyed for James Williams on Warrant dated the 22<sup>d</sup> day of August 1785 - this tract interferes Forty two acres and nineteen perches with the Lewis Price survey - James Williams conveyed to Thomas Vickroy from whom it was sold by the Sherriff of Bedford County to Frederick Dupps the present owner - No 3 amounting to Eighty five acres and thirty six perches is claimed by the Widow Mock by virtue of a settlement made by her late husband Jacob Mock thirty two years ago Jacob Mock devised the same to his widow the present owner -
