N.B. No evidence of the above Warrant being previously executed on the Land or of any person now claiming under the same. Report. The above Tract of Land is ascertained to be within the lines & constitutes a part of 231^{ac} Surveyed the 14th day of Dec^r 1784 on a Warrant to Joseph Swan dated the first day of Decem^r 1784 and said to be patented on said Warrant. Note the part represented by dotted lines represents the balance of Swan's Survey. Note Although Guthrie seems to recognise Swan's claim, yet his Warrant from the Location of it evidently intended to embrace a part of the Land afterwards Granted to Swan.
