



Situate on both sides of the Frankstown branch of Juniatta - in Frankstown Township, Huntingdon County containing two hundred and three and three fourth acres - and allowance of Six per Cent - Surveyed for Adam Weaver on Warrant dated the 8th day of September 1762 -

The dotted lines and part of the river represent part of the Draught of a tract of Land Surveyed for Ralph Aston and William Loyd on 2 warrants dated the 2nd day of December 1762 - this tract interferes two Hundred and three and one half Acres with the Adam Weaver survey - Ralph Aston and William Loyd conveyed to John Little and John Lukens who conveyed to Jacob Grieb who conveyed to Christian Shiveley who conveyed to Christian Ghost the present owner
