



A Draft of a tract of Land Situate on a Branch of Dunnings Creek Called Trout Run - In St. Clair Township Bedford County containing Four Hundred and forty eight Acres and one Hundred and fifty perches and allowance of six per cent for roads & so - surveyed for John Shee on Warrant dated the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of June 1763.

N° 1 represented by the dotted and black lines is a draft of a tract of Land surveyed for Francis Lytle on order N° 4514 dated the 21<sup>st</sup> day of October 1767. this tract Interferes Two Hundred and seventy nine & one fourth acres with the John Shee tract. Francis Lytle conveyed to Edward Milne who conveyed to George Armstrong who conveyed to Charles Smith who conveyed to Isacc Fickes who also bought as much of the John Shee tract as interferes with Francis Lytle from Thomas Stewartson acting as agent for Divers persons who claimed under John Shee - Isacc Fickes devised the same to Jacob Fickes the present owner.
