



In pursuance of the settlement of Nathan Winton commenced about the year 1804 was surveyed on the 10th day of October 1831 the within described tract of land, situate partly in Rome and partly in Athens townships, containing 539 acres 61 perches and allowance of six per cent roads &c. The North west 97 acres 81 perches having been surveyed for Samuel Winton, and being in Athens township Crawford county. The North East 38 acres 42 perches, situate in Rome, for Joseph Patten. The 163 acres 81 perches, situate partly in Rome and partly in Athens and between said Patten and Winton, for Joseph Nourse and - Austin. The 44 acres 25 perches, situate in Rome and south of said Nourse & Austin, and south of Oil Creek, for the above named Samuel Winton. The 67 acres 27 perches south of said Winton & also in Rome, for the heir or heirs of Frederick Clark. The 20 acres 49 perches, south of said Clark & also in Rome for - Humphry's heirs. The residue, 108 acres 95 perches, for David Winton and Charles Saunders, also in Rome, agreeably to the within plot and description.
