Beginning at a post in the South line of Warrant 1776 two hundred and ten rods West of the South East corner of said Warrant thence $N 3\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$. 164 rods to a post, thence $N 86\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} W$. 105 rods to a post, thence $S 3\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} W$. 164 rods to a post in the South line of said Warrant, thence $S 86\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E$. 105 rods to the place of beginning.

A draft of a tract of land situated in the township of Highland and County of Elk Containing 101 Acres and 85 perches and allowance of Six per cent for roads &c. Surveyed for Jas. G. Townsend the 27th day of Oct. 1885, It being a part of a larger tract of 1004 Acres and Allowance Originally Surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Thomas M. Willing dated the 18th day of August, 1792.
