



In pursuance of a warrant dated the 11th day of February A.D. 1831 ^{19th of February and} Surveyed the 5th day of March 1831 unto Benjamin Chew the Younger the within described tract of Land situate in Blockley Township in the County of Philadelphia containing ninety four perches being unimproved

Beginning at a corner on the south side of the Lancaster Turnpike Road or High Street continued and on the west side of a new laid out Road or Street 50 feet wide, thence along the south side of of the said Turnpike Road or High Street continued $N 78^{\circ} W 9.3 P$ to a corner at a board fence standing on Land claimed by Jacob Hoffman thence by the same $S 12^{\circ} W 9.9 P$ to a corner, thence by the same $N 78^{\circ} W 5$ links to a corner in the line of Land of George C. Lintner Esquire now deceased, thence by the same $S 12^{\circ} W 9.9 P$ to a corner in the line of Land of Jacob Hoffman thence by the same $S 78^{\circ} E 9.5 P$ to the West side of the said new laid out Road, thence by the same $N 12^{\circ} E 10 P$ to the beginning
