



A Draught of a ~~Tract of Land~~ Piece of Meadow Ground situate between the Lands of Moyamensing & Nicocose the Delaware River resurveyed for Clement Plumsted Esq<sup>r</sup> the 6<sup>th</sup> April 1743 in pursuance of a verbal order from the Secretary Beginning at a Post by the side of the Great Road leading to Greenwich Point being also a corner of John Shilley's Meadow and from thence extending by the said Shilley's Ground & Meadow Ground late of Andrew Wheeler deced West sixty four Perches and a Half to a post between two marked Ash's Thence by Nobles Meadow Ground North one Degree East sixty three Perches and a Half to a post between two marked Hickery stood Thence by Meadow Ground now of John Howell South Eighty Eight Deg<sup>s</sup> & a Half East Twenty Eight Perches to a corner of other Meadow Ground lately patented to the s<sup>d</sup> Clement Plumsted Thence by the same South three Degrees East Thirty five Perches to a corner and East Twenty six Perches to a Post by the said great Road Thence by the same South sixteen Deg<sup>s</sup> East Twenty nine Perches to the place of Beginning containing Fifteen Acres and One Hundred and fifty Perches Resurveyed the 6<sup>th</sup> Day of April A. D. 1743
