



The above is a Draught of a Survey made 15<sup>th</sup> April 1785 in pursuance of an Order of Survey N<sup>o</sup> 3673 in the name of Robert Callender dated 25<sup>th</sup> July 1769 containing three hundred and thirty acres and 112 perches and allowence of six P. Cent for Roads &c and is called Gibsons Choice

Note A return of the above survey I forwarded to the Surveyor Generals Office by my colleague Mr. Hoge, but he by the directions or with the approbation of the Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> (as Mr. Hoge informs me) made out another draught and returned it for a William A. Lungan on application N<sup>o</sup> 3671.

Note also - A Return of the same land described in this Draft was bro<sup>t</sup> to the Survr<sup>l</sup> General's Office on the 19<sup>th</sup> Octob<sup>r</sup> 1785 by M<sup>r</sup> John Hoge purporting to be Surveyd on Appl<sup>n</sup> N<sup>o</sup> 3671 in the name of W<sup>m</sup> A. Lungan; But there was no Ret<sup>n</sup> of this for Robert Callender of this land before 14<sup>th</sup> day of October 1788 when M<sup>r</sup> David Redick bro<sup>t</sup> this to y<sup>e</sup> Office of Survr<sup>l</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> Office - And I positively deny ever having given M<sup>r</sup> Hoge any permission or directions, directly or indirectly to alter or change the Return from Callenders name to the name of W<sup>m</sup> A. Lungan.
