 Wilson the 12th & 13th Days of April A.D. 1805 in Pursuance of his Warrant for 90^o dated the 22nd December A.D. 1804 &c.
 that part within the red lines where the letter D stands belongs to Jacob Geesy's heirs &c. Now being Requested by the said
 Michael Mitzel and Henry Ziegler to make Return of the part within the yellow lines of 122^o 100 prs. &c. for the use of said
 Henry Ziegler &c.
