



Situate on the waters of the Middle or Beaver dam Branch of Frankstown Branch of Juniata = about one mile south west from Hollidaysburg In Frankstown township Huntingdon County containing three hundred and twenty seven acres and allowance of six per cent Surveyed the 15th day of June 1767 for John Litten on order dated the 1st day of August 1766 No. 477 Daniel Africa D.S.

To Jacob Spangler Esqr. S.G. Thomas Woods Pat'd Timothy McTinley not Pat'd
 The purple coulered lines is part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Thomas Woods on warrant dated the 20th day of September 1762. This tract interferes three hundred and six acres with the John Litten Survey Thomas Woods conveyed to Geo. Woods, and John Baynton, George Morgan and Samuel Wharton, John Bayntons interest was sold by the Sheriff of Huntingdon County to Michael F. Simpson. George Morgan conveyed his interest to Benj^m Wyncoop who conveyed to M. F. Simpson. ^{Sam^l Wharton} George Morgans interest was sold to M. F. Simpson by Benj^m Wyncoop assignee of Samuel Wharton, M. F. Simpson abandoned his claim to the interference. George Woods also appears to have abandoned his claim to the interference. The dotted lines represent part of a survey made for Timothy McTinley on Warrant dated the 3th day of March 1763. This tract interferes six acres and one hundred and thirty one perches with the John Litten survey. Timothy McTinley conveyed to Richard Tea who conveyed to George Woods who conveyed to Adam Holiday who devised the same to William Holiday the present owner
